

(Amount of rice a person eats each year/ by country)





Denganmal is a small village in the west part of India. Only about 500 people live there. There is no water so the only drinking water comes from two wells at the foot of a mountain. Because there are always lots of people waiting for getting water, it always takes a long time to wait and a long walk back home.

To get water, men marry a second- sometimes even a third woman. Their work is to get water for the family. They call these women "water wives". They are often widows or single mothers. They get married for "respect."

Take India woman Tuki for example, she is Sakharam Bhagat's first wife. When they were younger, Tuki had to look after the family while her husband went to work. Tuki needed to cook, clean, and feed her children, but she faced a big problem: there was no water. The only way is to walk to a well or to a river and carry water back home. It can take up to 12 hours to go there and go back home. " 33 "

Tuki said. Because of it, her husband married again and again.

Usually, water wives don't really share husbands and don't often live together. Besides getting water, they also help cook, clean and wash clothes and so on. In fact, water wives are illegal in India, but it's hard to change water wife now.
